Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice in accordance with paragraph (3) of Regulation 33 and paragraph (3) of Regulation 27 of the Telephone Regulations, 1957, that the call charge payable for a transferred charge telephone call which is established to the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man from the country mentioned in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall be as set out in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice in accordance with paragraph (2) of Regulation 33 and paragraph (3) of Regulation 27 of the Telephone Regulations, 1957, that the charges payable for the attempt to provide a transferred charge telephone call from the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man to the country mentioned in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall be as set out in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

This charge is payable when a person making a

call from a place in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man to any of the countries mentioned requests that the call charges be reversed, and :

- the consent of the person answering on the called telephone is given, but the call is not established, or
- the consent of the person answering on the called telephone is refused, and the call is established, or
- such consent is refused and the call is not established.

The charge is payable in addition to any other charges payable by virtue of the Telephone Regulations, 1957, for or in respect of the call or the application therefor.
