#### Reduced rate calls

The charges referred to in paragraphs 2(2), 3(2) and 3(3) may be reduced at such times or during such periods as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct.

#### 5. Services and facilities

- (1) Temporary transfer of calls. The charge for the service referred to in regulation 29(1) of the Telephone Regulations, 1957, when given in respect of incoming calls to a vehicle, shall be that fixed by the said regulation.
- (2) Inland fixed time calls. The booking charge for a single fixed time call or a series of fixed time calls to be made from a vehicle shall be that fixed by regulation 30 of the Telephone Regulations, 1957, as amended by regulation 2(6) of the Telephone Amendment (No. 1) Regulations, 1958.
- (3) Inland personal calls. The personal charge in respect of an application for an inland personal call to be made from a vehicle shall be that fixed by regulation 31 of the Telephone Regulations, 1957.
- (4) Inland transferred charge calls. Where the service referred to in regulation 32 of the Telephone Regulations, 1957, is given in respect of calls made to a vehicle, the transfer fee payable in addition to the charge for the call shall be that fixed by the said regulation. said regulation.
- (5) Advice of duration and charge. The charge for the service referred to in regulation 35 of the Telephone Regulations, 1957, when given in relation to calls to a vehicle, shall be 3d. for each call of which particulars are supplied, and when given in relation to calls from a vehicle shall be 6d. for each call of which particulars are supplied.
- (6) Telegraph facilities. Where a telephone message is sent from a vehicle to the appropriate Post Office operator for further transmission to the addressee as a written telegram, the charge shall be 2s. 6d. for the telephone call involved (whatever its duration), in addition to the charge for the transmission of the telegram.

### NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT, 1952

23rd October, 1959.
