THE IMPORTED LIVESTOCK ORDER, 1958 SEIZURE NOTICE (LIVESTOCK)

I, Martin Steele, being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 9th day of May, 1960, at, or in the vicinity of Ledlie's Saleyard, Banbridge, Co. Down, the undermentioned one (1) livestock was seized in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.
