The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 4 of the Cran Measures Act, 1908, (8 Edw. 7. c. 17), and all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows :

1. The fee which may be taken by an inspector of weights and measures in respect of the verification and marking of a measure under the said Act shall be five pence for each cran or quarter-cran measure.

2. The Weights and Measures (Cran Measures : Verification and Marking Fees) Order, 1950 (S.I. 1950/521 (1950 II, p. 1512), is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Cran Measures : Verification and Marking Fees) Order, 1960, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1960.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on the 1st September, 1960, increases the fee to be taken by an inspector in respect of the verification and marking of cran and quarter-cran measures.
