The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 21(1) of the Finance Act, 1948, as amended by Part II of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1958, entitled "The Purchase Tax (No. 3) Order, 1960."

This Order brings into force a new list of drugs and medicines which are free of purchase tax. The list supersedes the existing list shown in the Pur-

chase Tax (No. 1) Order, 1960, as amended by the Purchase Tax (No. 2) Order, 1960.

The new list comprises all substances and preparations exempted under those Orders, but certain substances formerly classified by reference to their chemical names are now entered according to the name approved by the British Pharmacopoeia Commission. Such entries in the Schedule to the Order, others which appear for the first time and amendments to existing entries are printed in Heavy Type.

The Order comes into operation on the 15th June, 1960, and has been published as Statutory Instruments, 1960, No. 968.

IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE IN
NORTHERN IRELAND

QUEEN'S BENCH DIVISION.—IN BANKRUPTCY

Robert John Carr, of 11 and 15 Kingsgate Street, Coleraine, in the County of Londonderry, Grocer and Fishmonger, was on the 14th day of June, 1960, adjudged Bankrupt.

PUBLIC SITTINGS will be held before the Court at the Royal Courts of Justice (Ulster) Belfast, on Tuesday, the 28th day of June, 1960, and on Thursday, the 21st day of July, 1960, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, whereat the Bankrupt is to attend, and to make a full disclosure and

discovery of his Estate and Effects. Creditors may prove their Debts, and at the first Sitting choose a Creditors' Assignee. At the last Sitting the Bankrupt is required to finish his examination.

All persons having in their possession any property of the Bankrupt should deliver it and all Debts due to the Bankrupt should be paid to Arthur Kenneth Pryde, Official Assignee, Royal Courts of Justice (Ulster), Belfast, to whom Creditors may forward their affidavits of Debt.
