THE IMPORTED LIVESTOCK ORDER, 1958 SEIZURE NOTICE (LIVESTOCK)

I, Robert J. Ballantine, Constable, R.U.C., being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 11th day of August, 1960, at, or in the vicinity of Windy Hill, Donemana, Co. Tyrone, the undermentioned forty-nine livestock were seized in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.
