

for the children attending the Sabbath School in connection with such Church and if any balance of such income should remain the same was to be used for such purposes in connection with the Church as the Committee for the time being might decide.

2. To the same Treasurer a sum of £500 for investment the yearly income thereof to be applied for the up-keep and repair of the Church property and buildings.
3. To the same Treasurer a sum of £500 for investment the yearly interest thereof to be applied for supplementing the stipend of the minister in active duty of such Church.
4. All the rest and residue of her Estate to the Foreign Mission of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland to be applied for the benefit of the Mission.

Probate of said Will with two Codicils was granted forth of the District Registry at Londonderry of the Queen's Bench Division (Probate) of the High Court of Justice, Northern Ireland, on the 29th day of November, 1960, to the Northern Bank, Ltd., of No. 16 Victoria Street, Belfast, the Executors in said Will named.

**THE IMPORTED LIVESTOCK ORDER, 1958
SEIZURE NOTICE (LIVESTOCK)**

I, Robert Thomas Murdock, being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 31st day of December, 1960, at, or in the vicinity of Livestock Mart, Lisnaskea, the undermentioned one livestock was seized in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.

Any person claiming that the livestock was at the time of seizure his property and either

(a) that it was not imported, removed or brought into the United Kingdom from the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man or the Republic of Ireland, or

(b) that it was not so imported, removed or brought in in contravention of the said Order, may give notice in writing to that effect to the Head Constable, at Lisnaskea R.U.C. Station, such notice to be received within 21 days of the date of seizure, or where notice of the seizure is published in the Belfast Gazette, within ten days of such publication, whichever period shall terminate the later.

If no such claim is received as aforesaid the said Order provides that the livestock shall be deemed to be condemned as forfeited.
