**DRAINAGE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947
(REPRINT TO 1952)**

**ORDER CONFIRMING SCHEME FOR THE RIVER FLURRY,
COUNTY ARMAGH**

WHEREAS the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter called "the Ministry") is of the opinion that the execution of drainage works on that part of the River Flurry which is situated wholly in County Armagh and which the Drainage Council for Northern Ireland has determined should be treated as a main watercourse for the purpose of the Drainage Act (Northern Ireland) 1947 (Reprint to 1952) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") is expedient for the drainage of land in the area of the said river.

AND Whereas H. McM. Taggart, B.Sc., M.I.C.E., Chief Engineer of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, prepared on the 27th March, 1961, on behalf of the Ministry a report embodying a drainage scheme in accordance with the provisions of Section 4 of the Act for the execution of drainage works on the said river (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme").

And Whereas on the 10th April, 1961, copies of the Scheme, together with an estimate of the cost thereof were sent by the Ministry to the Armagh County Council, 1 Charlemont Place, Armagh, and to the Newry No. 2 Rural District Council, Monaghan Row, Newry, in accordance with the provisions of Section 5(1)(a) of the Act and a notice stating that the Scheme had been prepared was duly published in the Belfast Gazette on 14th April, 1961, and in three newspapers during the week ended 15th April, 1961, in accordance with the provisions of Section 5(1)(b) of the Act.

And Whereas the Armagh County Council and the Newry No. 2 Rural District Council caused copies of the Scheme to be exhibited in their principal offices during the period from 14th April to 14th May, 1961, inclusive in accordance with the provisions of Section 5(2)(a) of the Act.

And Whereas the only authorities charged with the maintenance of any road, bridge or culvert which appears as likely to be affected by the execution of the Scheme are the Armagh County Council and the Ulster Transport Authority.

And Whereas no observations in regard to the Scheme have been received by the Ministry from the Armagh County Council or the Ulster Transport Authority.

And Whereas the only observations received in regard to the Scheme from interested persons have been considered in accordance with Section 6(a) of the Act.

Now Therefore the Ministry in pursuance of the provisions of Section 6(c) of the Act by this Order confirms the Scheme.
