NOTICE is hereby given, pursuant to the Statute 30 and 31 Vic., cap. 54, sec. 19, that the above-named Michael Cardinal Logue, who died on the 19th day of November, 1924, by his Will, dated 24th July, 1910, made the following Charitable Bequests:—

He bequeathed to Most Rev. Patrick O'Donnell, Catholic Bishop of Raphoe, or to the person who at the time of his (Testator's) death may be Catholic Bishop of Raphoe, all his shares in the Belleek Pottery Company, in Trust to pay the Income or Dividends thereof to such objects of Charity in the Diocese of Raphoe as may be determined by the Catholic Bishop of Raphoe for the time being.

To his successor in Office and to the succeeding Catholic Archbishops of Armagh, all his Altar requisites for use in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh.

To his Executors and Trustees as the nucleus of a Diocesan Consulting Library, all the books bequeathed to him by his predecessor, Most Rev. Daniel M'Gettigan, and all his own books.

To the person who might succeed him as Catholic Archbishop of Armagh, £700 Great Northern Railway Ordinary Stock, standing in the joint names of himself and Rt. Rev. Peter J. Byrne, in Trust to apply the Dividends thereof for the maintenance of St. Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh.

To the person who might succeed him as Catholic Archbishop of Armagh, the remnant of bequest of the late Dr. Lynch, of Belfast, which came to Testator's hands, viz.:—Two One-thousand Dollar Bonds in the New York Central Hudson Railway, Two One-thousand Dollar Bonds in the Canadian Pacific Railway, and

One One-thousand Six per cent. Gold Coin Mortgage Bond, Philadelphia and Erie Railway, in Trust for the higher education of boys, ecclesiastical and lay, or girls in Ireland, and not elsewhere.

To his successor for his own use and the use of his successors the Catholic Primates, all his Paintings, Pictures, Works of Art, and other household ornaments existing in the Arch-Episcopal residence (except two Paintings of himself by Gagliairdi therein disposed of).

He directed that any money or property of any kind or description to which at the time of his death he might have been entitled by Will, Deed, or otherwise, howsoever, for charitable, educational or religious purposes, should be placed at the disposal of his successor for the purpose intended by the Donors or Testators; and should they not have determined the objects to which such donations or bequests should be applied, he directed his successor to determine such.

To his Executors and Trustees the bequest made to him by the late Philip Keenan, of Clones, to apply the same for the benefit of the society known as St. Patrick's Catholic Orphan Society, Armagh.

To the Catholic Curates of Armagh at the time of his death, £100 for celebrating in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh, Masses for the repose of his Soul and the Souls of his parents and immediate relations, and for any "intentions" which he might have forgotten, the honorarium for each Mass to be double the Diocesan honorarium.

After the payment of his debts, funeral and testamentary expenses, and certain pecuniary Bequests, he bequeathed all the rest, residue and remainder of his property of every kind and description to be invested by his Executors and Trustees, and the Interest, Income or Dividends to arise therefrom to be applied for the benefit of St. Patrick's Catholic Orphan Society, Armagh.

By a Codicil to his said Will, dated 27th November, 1910, he directed that the bequest to him by the late John M'Quaide, of Middletown, amounting to £2,693 13s, invested in Great Southern and Western Railway Debenture Stock and Ulster Railway Company Debenture Stock, be realised, and the proceeds and dividends therefrom applied as follows:—One half to be applied to the payment of the debt on the Cathedral house property in Banbrook, and the other half to be invested in Trustee Securities for the benefit of St. Patrick's Diocesan Orphan Society.

By a Codicil to his said Will, dated 27th February, 1915, he devised and bequeathed to his successor, the Catholic Archbishop of Armagh, all properties devised and bequeathed to him (Testator) under the Wills of James Joseph Scallan, of 2 Lower Prince Edward Terrace, Blackrock, County Dublin, and Miss Maria Close, of Belfast, for charitable purposes upon Trust for the purposes and to the uses set forth in said respective Wills.

By a Codicil to his said Will, dated 9th November, 1923, he bequeathed to his Executors and Trustees for the use of the person who might succeed him in the office of Catholic Archbishop of Armagh for his life,

and in like manner for the use of succeeding Archbishops of Armagh, all his silver and plated ware, glass, china, and household furniture of every kind; his carriages, motor-car, harness, stable fittings, Pectoral Crosses and Episcopal Rings (except the ring and cross specifically disposed of by his said Will); all gold and silver articles belonging to him either in Armagh or in Dundalk, and such of his Episcopal ornaments as his successor as Catholic Archbishop of Armagh might select, upon Trust, to permit the same to be used and enjoyed by the person for the time being holding the office of Catholic Archbishop of Armagh for ecclesiastical purposes and as an adjunct to said office.

Probate of said Will (with four codicils) was granted forth of the King's Bench Division (Probate) of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland to Rt. Rev. Monsignor Michael Quinn, of Dungannon, in the County of Tyrone, Parish Priest and Vicar-General; Rt. Rev. Monsignor Patrick Segrave, of Drogheda, in the County of Louth, Archdeacon and Vicar-General; and Very Rev. Felix Canon M'Nally, of Upper Killevey, in the County of Armagh, Parish Priest, the Executors and Trustees named in said Will.
