REGULATIONS, 1925.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (DRIED MILK) REGULATIONS, 1925.

NOTICE is hereby given, pursuant to section 1 (3) of the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland has made regulations on the 16th day of July, 1925, under the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, the Public Health Act, 1896, the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and the Public Health (Milk Regulations) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, entitled "The Public Health (Condensed Milk) Regulations, 1925," and "The Public Health (Dried Milk) Regulations, 1925," prescribing the labelling and composition of condensed and dried mild respectively.

TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under the powers conferred on it by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Brush and Broom trade in Northern Ireland as defined in the Schedule to the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom Trade, Northern Ireland) (Constitution, Proceedings and Meetings) Regulations, 1924, dated 28th August, 1924, hereby give notice that they propose to vary and to cancel certain minimum rates of wages for male and female workers in the said trade.

On request to the Trade Board, particulars of the proposed variation and cancellation of minimum rates will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the Eighteenth day of July, 1925.
