URBAN DRAINAGE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1957

ORDER CONFIRMING A DRAFT URBAN DRAINAGE SCHEME FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF DRAINAGE IN THE CAMLOUGH AREA, CO. ARMAGH

WHEREAS the Council of the Newry No. 2 Rural District (hereinafter called "the Council") being duly authorised in that behalf by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (hereinafter called "the Ministry") prepared a draft urban drainage scheme (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") pursuant to the provisions of the above-mentioned Act for the improvement of drainage in the Camlough area.

And Whereas the scheme was exhibited at the offices of the Council during a period of one month from 22nd May, 1961, and a copy of the Scheme was forwarded to the Ministry of Commerce, to Armagh County Council and to the Armagh County Planning Officer as required by sub-Section (1) (a) of Section four of the said Act.

And Whereas pursuant to the provisions of sub-Section (1) (b) of Section four of the said Act a notice stating that the Scheme had been prepared and further stating as by the said Act required was duly published in two newspapers on the 20th May, 1961, and in the Belfast Gazette on 19th May, 1961.

And Whereas an observation in regard to the Scheme has been received by the Council and the Ministry.

And Whereas in accordance with sub-Section (1) of Section five of the said Act the Ministry has considered the said observation.

And Whereas by Order dated the 31st day of August, 1962, made in pursuance of sub-Section (1) of Section twenty of the said Act the Ministry designated that part of the Newry No. 2 Rural District to which the Scheme relates an urban area for the purposes of the said Act.

Now therefore the Ministry in exercise of the

power contained in sub-Section (1) of Section five of the said Act by this Order confirms the Scheme.
