Whereas the Council of the Urban County District of Cookstown (hereinafter referred to as "the Urban Council") on the 1st day of October, 1962, submitted a proposal to the Council of the Administrative County of Tyrone (hereinafter referred to as "the County Council") for the alteration of the boundary of the said Urban County District:

And Whereas the County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 24 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of all other powers thereunto them enabling, at a meeting held on the 10th day of December, 1962, made an Order (as set out in the schedule and hereinafter referred to as "the Order") giving effect to the said proposal:

And Whereas the Ministry of Health and Local Government (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") is satisfied that the County Council have complied with the provisions of the said Act and the Urban Districts Boundaries (Procedure) Order, 1936, as to the giving of notice of the provisions of the Order:

And Whereas no appeal has been presented to the Ministry:

And Whereas it is enacted in effect by section 24 (4) of the said Act that the Order shall be submitted to the Ministry and that the Ministry may confirm the Order without modification or subject to such modifications as the Ministry thinks fit or may disallow the Order:

Now Therefore the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 24 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and of every other power in this behalf, hereby confirms the Order.

### SCHEDULE

#### ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF TYRONE

##### URBAN COUNTY DISTRICT OF COOKSTOWN

*The Local Government Act (N.I.), 1898-1934, and  
the Urban District Boundaries (Procedure) Order,  
1936*

#### ORDER OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF TYRONE ALTERING AND EXTENDING THE BOUNDARY OF THE SAID URBAN COUNTY DISTRICT

Whereas on the 1st day of October, 1962, an application was made by the Council of the said Urban County District of Cookstown (hereinafter referred to as the said "Urban Council") to the County Council of the County of Tyrone (hereinafter called the "County Council") pursuant to the provisions of Section 24 of the Local Government Act (N.I.), 1934, for the alteration and extension of the existing boundary of the said Urban County District.

And Whereas the said County Council being satisfied that a prima facie case had been made out for

the proposal to alter the existing boundary of the said Urban County District by extending same, and pursuant to the said Act, and to the said Order, by Resolution dated 12th day of November, 1962, appointed W. H. Smith, Esq., LL.B., W. S. Rea, Esq., B.A., M.B.E., and William Purdy, Esq., being members of the County Council, to hold such Local Inquiry as authorised and prescribed by the said Act and Order.

And Whereas the said Messrs. Rea and Purdy held such Local Inquiry (due notice of same and of the purport thereof having been previously given in compliance with the requirements of the said Order) at the Urban Council Chambers, Cookstown, in the said County, on Monday, 3rd day of December, 1962.

And Whereas the said Messrs. Rea and Purdy duly made their report of such Inquiry to the County Council at the Adjourned Quarterly Meeting thereof, held on the 10th day of December, 1962.

And Whereas the County Council on consideration of said Report at said meeting held on the 10th day of December, 1962, did adopt the same and directed that steps be taken to have an Order prepared and made embodying the terms of said report for submission to the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland.

Now, Therefore, We the County Council of the said Administrative County of Tyrone in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the said Section 24 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and all other powers us thereunto enabling Do Hereby Order as follows:—

1. The adjustment or award made by J. W. Drury, Esq., and bearing date the 26th day of September, 1901, and the Order of the County Council dated the 6th day of September, 1906, as approved by an Order of the Local Government Board, dated 27th day of March, 1907, and the Order of the County Council dated 11th September, 1939, as approved by an Order cited as the Cookstown Urban District (Alteration) Order, 1947, and dated 13th February, 1947, in so far as they determine the financial relations between the Administrative County of Tyrone and the Urban County District of Cookstown shall apply and have effect in like manner as if the Urban County District of Cookstown therein mentioned were the Urban County District as extended by this Order when confirmed by the Ministry of Health and Local Government.

2. That the boundary of the Urban County District of Cookstown be altered by including within the said Urban County District the area described in the schedule hereto and more particularly delineated on the map annexed hereto and coloured pink.

3. That the financial adjustments consequent upon the making of this Order shall be the subject of an Agreement to be entered into by the parties concerned, such agreement to be approved of by the Ministry and in the absence of agreement between the parties to be determined by the Ministry.

4. That every person holding office on the 1st day of April, 1963, as County Councillor or District Councillor for any area affected by the Order, and every County Councillor or District Councillor elected for any such area before the 1st day of April, 1963, shall be deemed to have been elected for the area as altered by the Order, and the County Council or District Council, of which he is a member, shall be deemed to have been elected for the County District as altered by the Order.

5. That the Bye-Laws at present in force in the said Urban County District shall apply to the area as altered by the Order.

6. That the local and adopted Acts and local Orders in force in the said Urban County District shall apply to the area as altered by the Order.

7. That notwithstanding the alteration of the boundary of the said Urban County District by the Order, the said County Council shall have power to recover arrears of rates in the area affected.

8. The said altered area do form the said Urban County District of Cookstown for all purposes as from the 1st day of April, 1963.

9. This Order shall be cited as the Cookstown Urban District (Alteration) Order, 1962.

### SCHEDULE

#### URBAN COUNTY DISTRICT OF COOKSTOWN

##### NOTE

In this Order the townland boundaries referred to are those which appear on the Ordnance 1:2500 plans (Revision of 1935) published in 1937, which contain full details of the townland mereings.

For the purpose of the Description selected points have been numbered for reference and these reference numbers appear on the "Accompanying Map," which is on a scale of 6in. to 1 mile and which will be referred to as "the Map."

##### DESCRIPTION OF BOUNDARY OF EXTENDED AREA

- (1-2) Starting at Point No. 1 on the map where the Boundaries between the existing Urban District and the townland of Clare and Killymoon Demesne intersect, the Boundary follows a westerly direction along the boundary between the existing Urban District and the townland of Killymoon Demesne for a distance of about 25 L. yards to No. 2 on the Map at the intersection of the boundaries between the existing Urban District and the townlands of Scotchtown and Killymoon Demesne.
- (2-3) It then follows the townland boundary between Scotchtown and Killymoon Demesne in a south westerly direction for a distance of about 300 L. yards to No. 3 on the map at the intersection of the townland boundaries of Scotchtown, Killymoon Demesne and Coolnahavil.
- (3-4) From this point it continues in a south westerly direction along the townland boundary between Killymoon Demesne and Coolnahavil for a distance of about 375 L. yards to No. 4 on the map.
- (4-5) From this point it follows the east side of a stone built store for its full length and then turns west along the south side of the store for a distance of about 7 L. yards at which point it again joins the townland boundary between Killymoon Demesne and Coolnahavil. From thence it follows the townland boundary in a southerly direction for a distance of about 160 L. yards to No. 5 on the map.
- (5-6) From No. 5 the new boundary follows a straight undefined line for 116 L. yards south easterly in the direction of the centre of the highest tower of Killymoon Castle, to No. 6 on the map.
- (6-7) From No. 6 it then turns in a southerly direction and follows a straight undefined line for 123 L. yards to No. 7 which is at a point in the centre of the Ballinderry River approximately 34 L. yards down river from the point where the boundary between the townlands of Gortallowry (main portion) and Killymoon Demesne leaves the centre of the said river approximately 483 L. yards east of King's Bridge.
- (7-8) Thence it follows the centre of the Ballinderry River in a south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 34 L. yards to No. 8 on the map at the point, previously mentioned where the boundary between the townlands of Gortallowry (main portion) and Killymoon Demesne leaves the centre of the said river.
- (8-9) From this point it follows the townland boundary between Killymoon Demesne and Gortallowry (main portion) along the centre of the Ballinderry river in a south westerly and north westerly direction for a distance of about 737 L. yards to No. 9 on the map, which is at the intersection of the townland boundaries between Killymoon Demesne, Gortallowry and Coolkeeghan (at King's Bridge).
- (9-10) Thence it continues along the townland boundary between Gortallowry (main portion) and Coolkeeghan (in the centre of the Ballinderry River) in a north westerly direction for a distance of about 330 L. yards to No. 10 on the map, which is at the intersection of the townland boundaries between Gortallowry (main portion) Coolkeeghan and Glebe (Derryloran).
- (10-11) From this point it continues along the townland boundary between Gortallowry (main portion) and Glebe (Derryloran (in centre of Ballinderry river) in a north westerly direction for a distance of about 770 L. yards to No. 11 on the map, which is at the intersection of the townland boundaries between Gortallowry Glebe (Derryloran) and Derryloran alias Kirktown (at Derryloran bridge).
- (11-12) Thence it continues along the townland boundary between Gortallowry (main portion) and Derryloran alias Kirktown (in the centre of the Ballinderry river) in a north westerly and northerly direction for a distance of about 810 L. yards to No. 12 on the map which is at the intersection of the townland boundaries between Gortallowry (main portion) Derryloran alias Kirktown and Sullenboy.
- (12-13) It thence continues along the townland boundary between Sullenboy and Derryloran alias Kirktown (in the centre of Ballinderry river) in a north westerly direction for a distance of about 397 L. yards to No. 13 on the map, which is the intersection of the townland boundaries between Sullenboy, Derryloran alias Kirktown and Tullagh.
- (13-14) From this point it follows the townland boundary between Tullagh and Derryloran alias Kirktown (in the centre of the Ballinderry river) in a south westerly and north westerly direction for a distance of about 177 L. Yards to No. 14 on the map which is at the intersection of the townland boundaries between Tullagh, Derryloran alias Kirktown and Drumard.
- (14-15) Thence it continues along the townland boundary between Tullagh and Drumard (in centre of the Ballinderry river) in a north westerly, south westerly and north westerly direction for a distance of about 377 L. yards to No. 15 on the map which is at a point in the centre of the Ballinderry River on the prolongation of a hedge along the east side of a lane leading to Tullagh Hill on north side of said river.
- (15-16) From this point it turns north east along the prolongation of the said hedge in a straight undefined line for a distance of about 13 L. yards until it meets the hedge running along the east side of the lane leading to Tullagh Hill. It thence follows the centre line of the hedge in a north easterly direction for a distance of about 367 L. yards and in a straight undefined line along the prolongation of the hedge for a distance of approximately 23 L. yards until it reaches the south side of a county road at No. 16 on the map where a boundary post or boundary mark will be erected.
- (16-17) It then crosses this road in a straight undefined line and continues along the centre

- line of a hedge in a northerly direction for a distance of about 270 L. yards until it meets the townland boundary between Tullagh and Aughlish at No. 17 on the map.
- (17-18) Thence it turns in a north easterly direction along the townland boundary between Tullagh and Aughlish for a distance of about 110 L. yards to No. 18 on the map, which is the intersection of the townland boundaries between Tullagh, Aughlish and Maloon.
- (18-19) From this point it follows along the townland boundary between Tullagh and Maloon in an easterly direction for a distance of about 100 L. yards until it meets the existing Urban District boundary at No. 19 on the map.
- (19-20) Thence it continues along the existing Urban District boundary in a northerly direction for a distance of about 170 L. yards to a point marked No. 20 on the map.
- (20-20A) It then continues along the centre of the hedge still in a northerly direction for a distance of about 150 L. yards until it again meets the existing Urban District boundary on the south side of Orritor Road at the point marked 20A on the map where a boundary post or boundary mark will be erected.
- (20A-21) It then crosses this road in a northerly direction and continues along the existing Urban District boundary in the same direction for about 440 L. yards to No. 21 on the map which is the point of intersection of the townland boundary between Maloon and Killyman with the existing Urban District boundary.
- (21-22) From No. 21 on the map it continues to follow the existing Urban District boundary in an easterly, north easterly and north westerly direction for a distance of about 1,100 L. yards until it reaches No. 22 on the map at the intersection of the townland boundary between Killyman and Coolreaghs with the existing Urban District boundary (137 L. yards to the north west of McGeagh's Well).
- (22-23) At this point (No. 22 on the map) the boundary turns and follows the existing Urban District boundary in a north easterly direction for a distance of about 87 L. yards to the boundary post on the south side of Lissan Road. Thence across the road and still following the existing Urban District boundary in the same direction for about 293 L. yards. Thence it turns north westerly for a distance of about 45 L. yards and thence turning north eastwards it continues for about 59 L. yards to a lane leading to Coolreaghs House; it then follows the existing Urban District boundary in a north westerly, northerly and north easterly direction for about 94 L. yards until it reaches the existing boundary marker on the west side of the County road. From thence it continues along the existing Urban District boundary in a northerly direction for a distance of about 290 L. yards until it reaches the intersection of the townland boundary between Claggan and Coolreaghs with the existing Urban District boundary at No. 23 on the map.
- (23-24) Here it turns south-east and follows the existing Urban District boundary for a distance of about 347 L. yards to No. 24 on the map which is at a hedge junction approximately 210 L. yards north east of a house named "Mount View."
- (24-25) Thence it turns east along the centre of the hedge for a distance of about 134 L. yards and south for a distance of about 33 L. yards and then turns easterly along the centre of the hedge until it meets the County road, a distance of about 97 L. yards, where a boundary post will be erected on the west side of the said road at No. 25 on the map.
- (25-26) From this point it crosses the County road and continues in an easterly, southerly and easterly direction for a distance of about 287 L. yards along the entire line of hedges until it reaches a hedge junction on the Londonderry County boundary, approximately 200 L. yards north east of "Glasgow's Hill."
- (26-26A) It then follows the County boundary between Tyrone and Londonderry for a distance of about 280 L. yards in a south easterly direction until it meets the existing Urban District boundary at a point marked 26A on the map.
- (26A-27) It then follows in a south easterly direction along the existing County boundary for a distance of about 487 L. yards until it reaches the intersection of the existing Urban District boundary with the said County boundary at the Moneymore Road (T.S.) from which point it follows the existing Urban District boundary, crossing the said road to No. 27 on the map, at which point a boundary post will be erected.
- (27-28) From this point the boundary follows the existing Urban District boundary in a southerly direction for a distance of about 208 L. yards, to a hedge junction, approximately 317 L. yards north west of Inverton House, No. 28 on the map, at which a boundary post will be erected.
- (28-29) Thence it turns east along the centre line of a hedge for a distance of about 192 L. yards to a point in the hedge in alignment with a track of a fence on south side at No. 29 on map.
- (29-30) Here it turns Southwards along the track of a fence for a distance of about 278 L. yards to No. 30 which is the north wall of a barn at Inverton House Farm.
