- (1) Alexander Thomson Park, M.A., Ph.D., an officer of the Ministry in place of Charles Ffolliott Darling and
- (2) Lowry Sinclair Duncan an officer of the Ministry to act as Deputy Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages for Northern Ireland:

Now I, Captain The Right Honourable Terence Marne O'Neill, D.L., Minister of Finance for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the power vested in me as aforesaid and of all other powers me thereunto enabling do by this Minute appoint as from the 19th March, 1963, and until further notice by me, the said Alexander Thomson Park, M.A., Ph.D., to be Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages for Northern Ireland and the said Lowry Sinclair Duncan to be Deputy Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages for Northern Ireland, to exercise and perform the powers and duties of the said respective offices which powers and duties I hereby assign to them.

ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1948

The Ministry of Commerce hereby gives notice that it has been requested by the Londonderry County Council to make an Order under section 17 of the Roads Act (Northern Ireland), 1948, the effect of which would be to authorise the abandonment of approximately 170 lineal yards of Route A.29, the

ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1948
