WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACT, 1949

To all holders of Aircraft Licences

Preamble. From the item Description of Station delete the words "a copy whereof is attached to this Licence" and substitute "(see 2 (1) below)".

Clause 2. Insert new sub-clause (1) as follows:—
"(1) This Licence shall be valid only when it has attached to it the Certificate of Approval of Aircraft Radio Installation issued by the United Kingdom Air Registration Board in respect of the Station, provided that the Station may be used during test flights in the United Kingdom in accordance with the terms of this Licence in the absence of the said Certificate."

The existing sub-clauses (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5) shall be renumbered (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6) respectively.
