SUPREME COURT

Rules of the Supreme Court, Northern Ireland

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th March, 1963, the Northern Ireland Supreme Court Rules Com-mittee pursuant to Section 7 of the Northern Ireland Act, 1962, made The Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (No. 1) Order, 1963 No. 61.

This Order makes the following amendments in the Rules of the Supreme Court:

Part I makes provision for the entry of appear-ances and also provides for the entering of such appearances by post in the case of litigants wishing to appear in person.

Part II makes provisions for the payment by the Bank of Ireland of interest on certain Supreme Court funds standing to the credit of the Account-ant-General in that Bank and also makes provision for the investment of certain funds in securities other than $3\frac{1}{2}$ % War Loan. It also provides for the investment of accumulated interest thereon.

Part III makes provision for the acceptance of photographic copies of documents in the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland and the offices thereof. The Order comes into force on the 1st June, 1963.

The Pensions Appeal Tribunals (Northern Ireland)

These Rules increase the maximum sum allowable as compensation for loss of time to appellants and their attendants under the Pensions Appeal Tribunals (Northern Ireland) Rules, 1946, as amended.

TREASURY

IMPORT DUTIES ACT, 1958

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 1 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz:—The Import Duties (General) (No. 3) Order, 1963.

This Order amends paragraph (b) of the proviso to Article 2 (1) (b) of the Import Duties (General) (No. 3) Order 1961, by omitting words which, if not removed, would nullify the effect of a forthcoming amendment to the European Free Trade Association (Origin of Goods) Regulations, 1960.

That amendment will provide that goods consigned from the Convention area to an exhibition held outside that area and then consigned from the exhibition to the United Kingdom will be treated in the same way as goods consigned from the area to the United Kingdom providing that certain conditions laid down by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise are fulfilled.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st May, 1963, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1963, No. 835.

AGRICULTURAL RETURNS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1939
