And Whereas the County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 24 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1934 (a) and of all other powers thereunto them enabling, at a meeting held on the 17th June, 1963, made the Omagh Urban District (Alteration) Order 1963 (as set out in the schedule and hereinafter referred to as "the Order") giving effect to the said proposal:

And Whereas the Ministry of Health and Local Government (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") is satisfied that the County Council have complied with the provisions of the said Act and the Urban Districts Boundaries (Procedure) Order 1936 (b) as to the giving of notice of the provisions of the Order:

And Whereas no appeal has been presented to the Ministry:

And Whereas it is enacted in effect by Section 24 (4) of the said Act that the Order shall be submitted to the Ministry and that the Ministry may confirm the Order without modification or subject to such modifications as the Ministry thinks fit or may disallow the Order:

Now Therefore the Ministry, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Section 24 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1934 and of every other power in this behalf, hereby confirms the Order.

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF TYRONE URBAN COUNTY DISTRICT OF OMAGH

The Local Government Acts (N.I.) 1898-1934, and
the Urban District Boundaries (Procedure) Order,
1936

Order of the County Council of Tyrone altering and extending the Boundary of the said Urban County District

Whereas on the 8th day of April, 1963, an application was made by the Council of the said Urban County District of Omagh (hereinafter referred to as the said "Urban Council") to the County Council of the County of Tyrone (hereinafter called the "County Council") pursuant to the provisions of Section 24 of the Local Government Act (N.I.), 1934, for the alteration and extension of the existing boundary of the said Urban County District.

And Whereas the said County Council being satisfied that a prima facie case had been made out for the proposal to alter the existing boundary of the said Urban County District by extending same, and pursuant to the said Act, and to the said Order, by

Resolution dated 8th day of April, 1963, appointed W. H. Smith, Esq., LL.B., W. S. Rea, Esq., B.A., M.B.E., and William J. Purdy, Esq., being members of the County Council, to hold such Local Inquiry as authorised and prescribed by the said Act and Order.

And Whereas the said Messrs. Smith, Rea and Purdy held such Local Inquiry (due notice of same and of the purport thereof having been previously given in compliance with the requirements of the said Order) at the County Hall, Omagh, in the said County, on Thursday, 9th day of May, 1963.

And Whereas the said Messrs. Smith, Rea and Purdy duly made their report of such Inquiry to the County Council at the Adjourned Quarterly Meeting thereof, held on the 17th day of June, 1963.

And Whereas the County Council on consideration of said Report at said meeting held on the 17th day of June, 1963, did adopt the same and directed that steps be taken to have an Order prepared and made embodying the terms of said report for submission to the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland.

Now, Therefore, We the County Council of the said Administrative County of Tyrone in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the said Section 24 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1934, and all other powers us thereunto enabling do hereby order as follows:—

1. The adjustment or award made by J. W. Drury, Esq., and bearing date the 26th day of September, 1901 in so far as it determines the financial relations between the Administrative County of Tyrone and the Urban County District of Omagh shall apply and have effect in like manner as if the Urban County District of Omagh therein mentioned were the Urban County District as extended by this Order when confirmed by the Ministry of Health and Local Government.

2. That the boundary of the Urban County District of Omagh be altered by including within the said Urban County District the area described in the schedule hereto and more particularly delineated on the map annexed hereto and edged pink.

3. That the financial adjustments consequent upon the making of this Order shall be the subject of an Agreement to be entered into by the parties concerned, such agreement to be approved of by the Ministry, and in the absence of agreement between the parties to be determined by the Ministry.

4. That every person holding office on the 1st day of April, 1964, as County Councillor or District Councillor for any area affected by the Order, and every County Councillor or District Councillor elected for any such area before the 1st day of April, 1964, shall be deemed to have been elected for the area as altered by the Order, and the County Council or District Council, of which he is a member, shall be deemed to have been elected for the County District as altered by the Order.

5. That the Bye Laws at present in force in the said Urban District shall apply to the area as altered by the Order.

6. That the local and adopted Acts and local Orders in force in the said Urban County District shall apply to the area as altered by the Order.

7. That notwithstanding the alteration of the boundary of the said Urban County District by the Order, the said County Council shall have power to recover arrears of rates in the area affected.

8. The said altered area do form the said Urban County District of Omagh for the purpose of the Electoral Law Act, 1962, as from 1st September, 1963 and for all other purposes as from 1st April, 1964.

9. This Order shall be cited as the Omagh Urban District (Alteration) Order, 1963.

Whereas the Council of the Administrative County of Tyrone at a meeting held on the 17th June, 1963, made the Omagh Urban District (Alteration) Order, 1963, altering the boundary of the Urban District of Omagh:

And Whereas the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") on the 30th August, 1963, made an Order confirming the said Order:

And Whereas by Section 7 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1922, it is enacted in effect that the Ministry may make Orders dividing an Urban District into wards and fixing the boundaries of such wards, altering the number and boundaries of the wards or altering the boundaries of the wards without altering their number, and apportioning the Urban District councillors among the wards:

And Whereas by virtue of an Order made by the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland on the 25th day of June, 1935, the Urban District of Omagh (hereinafter referred to as "the Urban District") was divided into three wards called respectively North Ward, South Ward and West Ward, and Urban District Councillors were assigned to the said Wards:

And Whereas it appears expedient to the Ministry after consultation with the Council of the Urban District that in consequence of the alteration of the

boundary of the Urban District the boundaries of the wards of the Urban District should be altered without altering their number and that Urban District Councillors should be apportioned thereto as hereinafter more particularly appears:

Now, Therefore, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland) 1898 to 1962 and of all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and directs as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Omagh Urban District (Wards) Order 1963.
2. The Order made by the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland on the 25th day of June, 1935, dividing the Urban District into Wards and apportioning the Urban District Councillors among the said Wards is hereby revoked.
3. The Urban District shall be divided into three Wards named respectively the North Ward, the South Ward and the West Ward, and comprising respectively the portions of the Urban District described in column 2 of the Schedule, and the Urban District Councillors shall be apportioned among the Wards as set forth in column 3 of the Schedule.

And Whereas the Ministry of Health and Local Government for Northern Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") on the 30th August, 1963, duly confirmed the said Order made by the County Council:

Now, Therefore, the Ministry, in exercise of its powers under the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland) 1898-1962 and of all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

- (1) This Order may be cited as the Omagh Rural District (Alteration of District Electoral Divisions) Order (Northern Ireland) 1963 and shall come into effect on the 1st September, 1963.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in any Order to the contrary the district electoral divisions of Edenderry, Mountjoy Forest East, Mountjoy Forest West and Omagh Rural in the said Rural District shall consist of the townlands, parts of townlands and places set forth by name in column 2 of the Schedule opposite to the names of such district electoral divisions.

And it is hereby declared that the foregoing provisions shall in no way affect or be deemed to affect the limits of any area heretofore determined by any Order to be the area of charge upon which any special expense as defined by Section 232 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 (b) or any other expenses directed by any Act to be defrayed as such special expenses are and shall be chargeable.
