Composition after Bankruptcy—Notice of Second Meeting.

IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE IN NORTHERN IRELAND.

KING'S BENCH DIVISION.—IN BANKRUPTCY.

In the Matter of JAMES FORREST, of Loy Street, Cookstown, in the County of Tyrone, Builder and Contractor, a Bankrupt.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a Second Meeting of the Creditors in this Matter will be held before the Court, at the Court House, Belfast, on Thursday, the 8th day of October, 1925, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the Proof of Debts, and for the purpose of deciding upon the offer of Composition made by the Bankrupt or his friends, and which was agreed to by the Creditors at the First Meeting held on the 17th day of September, 1925.
