TREASURY

IMPORT DUTIES ACT, 1958

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Sections 3 (6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz:—The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 11) Order 1963.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporarily exempted from import duty until 1st January, 1965, unless a shorter period is indicated against any item. Goods which were not exempt from import duty at the date of this Order are marked with an asterisk.

The partial exemption for photographic film base of cellulose acetate is also continued until 1st January, 1965.

The Order is also, in continuing the exemption of certain chemical compounds, revises their description. These compounds are marked with a dagger in Schedule 1 and the former descriptions are given in Schedule 2.

The Order comes into operation of the 1st January, 1964 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1963, No. 2048.

- (1) for the abatement of contributions and annual superannuation allowances payable under the Teachers (Superannuation) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1950 to 1956, of any persons in contributory service under those Acts who participate in the Graduated Pension Scheme under the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1959;
- (2) for the abatement of annual superannuation allowances payable under the Acts of 1950 to 1956 of persons in respect of whom a payment in lieu of graduated contributions has been made to the Northern Ireland National Insurance Fund;
- (3) that where that part of a teacher's annual superannuation allowance which is in respect of non-participating employment falls to be reduced because the teacher's retirement has been accelerated by misconduct, the amount remaining after the reduction shall not be less than the maximum graduated National Insurance pension which would have been payable if the employment had been participating; and
- (4) for the charging to the Teachers' Superannuation Account of expenditure in respect of payments in lieu and make minor amendments consequent upon the power given to employers under Section 9 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1959, to recover half of a payment in lieu from a repayment of contributions.

TEACHERS (SUPERANNUATION) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1950

HERRING INDUSTRY SCHEME, 1951
