TREASURY

IMPORT DUTIES ACT, 1958

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order

under Sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958 viz:—The Import Duties (General) (No. 1) Order, 1964.

This Order—

- (1) provides for the rates of import duty on certain goods in Chapters 40, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 65 and 94 of the Customs tariff, containing 5 per cent. or less by value of silk or man-made fibres, to be the same as those on similar goods containing no silk or man-made fibres. The effect is that the Commonwealth preference rate of duty on the goods concerned is removed; and in a few instances the full rate and the E.F.T.A. rate of duty is slightly reduced;
- (2) removes the Commonwealth preference rate of import duty on toys, dolls and certain other goods classified in Chapter 97 of the Customs tariff which contain more than 5 per cent. but not more than 20 per cent. by weight of silk or man-made fibres;
- (3) removes the specific rates of duty on certain boot etc. laces not containing silk or man-made fibres, while retaining the ad valorem rates;
- (4) removes the import duty (both full and E.F.T.A. rates) on locust bean kernels.

The Order comes into operation on the 5th February, 1964, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1964, No. 100.

ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1948

Trunk Road Improvement at Bolies, Co. Londonderry
