CEREMONIAL OBSERVED ON THE ASSUMPTION OF THE OFFICE OF GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND BY THE LORD ERSKINE OF RERRICK, G.B.E., ON 3rd DECEMBER, 1964.

The Lord Erskine of Rerrick was received on his arrival at the Royal Courts of Justice (Ulster), by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

The Lord Erskine took the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath before members of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland.

His Excellency entered the Nisi Prius Court where Her Majesty's Judges, Ministers of Northern Ireland and other Members of the Privy Council, Her Majesty's Lieutenants, The Right Honourable the Lord Mayor of Belfast, Magistrates, Members of Parliament, representatives of the Churches, of the Services and of Local Government and other persons were assembled.

After Her Majesty's Commission of Appointment of the Lord Erskine of Rerrick as Governor of Northern Ireland was read by the Prime Minister of Northern Ireland in the presence of the assembled company His Excellency subscribed the Oaths and proceeded with the Prime Minister, the Members of the Cabinet and the Clerk of the Privy Council to hold a Meeting of the Executive Committee of Northern Ireland.
