The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz.—The Import Duties (General) (No. 2) Order, 1965.

This Order provides for amendments to the Customs Tariff in respect of:

- 1 derivatives of certain compounds of organic chemicals,
- 2 certain lacquers, and
- 3 brush and broom handles of wood.

The effect is to correct errors in the Tariff which have recently come to light in order to restore the intended rates of import duty.

The Order comes into operation on the 7th April, 1965, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1965, No. 700.

and in the Matter of a Reference of
PERSONAL AND OFFICE STATIONERY
AND RELATED CLASSES OF GOODS

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Rule 8 of the Restrictive Practices Court (Resale Prices) Rules 1965 that on the Fifth day of April, 1965, there was issued out of the Restrictive Practices Court in England and Wales a Notice of Reference applying to the following classes of goods:

- 1 Letter paper, writing blocks, envelopes, letter cards, plain postcards, correspondence cards; boxes, pouches, wallets and writing compendiums, of paper or paperboard, containing only an assortment of paper stationery; all within headings 48.14 and 48.15 of the Convention for the Classification of Goods in Customs Tariffs (Cmnd. 1070) commonly known as and hereinafter called "the Brussels Nomenclature."
- 2 Registers, exercise books, notebooks, memorandum blocks, order books, receipt books, binders (loose-leaf or other), file covers and other stationery of paper or paperboard; albums and book covers, of paper or paperboard; all within heading 48.18 of the Brussels Nomenclature.
- 3 Paper or paperboard labels, whether or not printed or gummed; within heading 48.19 of the Brussels Nomenclature.
- 4 Paper or paperboard, cut to size or shape, and articles of paper or paperboard, for office use; index tabs, signals and eyelets of plastic, paper, leather or textile material for use therewith; all within headings 39.07, 42.05, 48.15, 48.21 and 62.05 of the Brussels Nomenclature.
- 5 Carbon paper in rolls or sheets; plastic carbon film all within headings 39.01 and 48.07 of the Brussels Nomenclature.
- 6 Carbon and other copying papers (including duplicator stencils) and transfer papers—cut to

size, whether or not put up in boxes; within heading 48.13 of the Brussels Nomenclature.

Unless the Court otherwise directs these proceedings will take place in England.

And notice is hereby further given that

- (a) any supplier of goods of any of the classes to which the said Notice of Reference applies who supplies such goods under arrangements for maintaining minimum prices on resale but who has not duly given notice to the Registrar pursuant to Section 6 (2) of the said Act in respect of such goods
- (b) any retailer of goods of any of the classes to which the said Notice of Reference applies and
- (c) any trade association representing employees in the distributive trades

who wishes to be represented before the Court in the proceedings must notify the Registrar of Restrictive Trading Agreements at the address below in writing within 28 days hereof stating the nature of his interest and whether he supports or opposes the maintenance of minimum resale prices in respect of all or any of the goods to which the said Notice of Reference applies and giving the name of his Solicitor (if any) and an address in the United Kingdom at which documents may be served upon him.

RELOAGH DRAIN DRAINAGE SCHEME
