A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING THE DESIGN FOR THE CUPRO-NICKEL CROWN PIECE COMMEMORATING THE LATE THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR WINSTON LEONARD SPENCER

CHURCHILL

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine a new design, hereinafter specified, for the cupro-nickel Crown, being one of the cupro-nickel coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1946, to be struck at Our Mint in London in commemoration of Our Right Trusty and Well-Beloved Counsellor, Sir Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Member of the Order of Merit, Member of the Order of the Companions of Honour, upon whom had been conferred the Territorial Decoration, deceased:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section eleven and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

Notwithstanding anything contained in Our Proclamation of the fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, the design for the cupro-nickel Crown to be struck at Our Mint in London in commemoration of the said Sir Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill shall be as follows:

For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "Elizabeth II Dei Gratia Regina F.D." and below the date of the year "1965," and for the reverse the effigy of the said Sir Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill with the word "Churchill." The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the sixth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this third day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, and in the Fourteenth year of Our Reign.

MINISTRY OF POWER

THE PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) (CONTINENTAL SHELF AND TERRITORIAL SEA) REGULATIONS, 1964.

The Minister of Power is prepared to receive between 9 a.m. on Monday, 9th August, 1965, and 6

p.m. on Friday, 17th September, 1965, applications in accordance with The Petroleum Production (Continental Shelf and Territorial Sea) Regulations, 1964 (S.I. 1964, No. 708) for production licences in respect of the blocks to which the numbers specified in the schedule of this notice have been assigned on a map deposited at the Ministry of Power, Thames House South, Millbank, London, S.W.1. The map may be inspected on request during the said period between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. except on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays. Copies of the map may be inspected by prior appointment at the offices of the Ministry of Power at 101 George's Street, Edinburgh 2, and Government Buildings, Gabalfa, Cardiff. In considering any application received during the said period the Minister will not take account of the day on which it was received.

2. To assist the Minister in considering applications, applicants are invited to indicate in as much detail as practicable the degree of preference which they attach to the blocks to which their application relates.

3. Following is a summary of the consideration which the Minister, with the consent of the Treasury, has decided to require in respect of production licences granted in response to applications made during the said period.

- (1) Upon grant of the licence the sum of twenty-five pounds for each square kilometre comprised in the licensed area.
- (2) In respect of the first year from the date of surrender of part of the licensed area (on exercise of the option to continue as to the remainder), the sum of forty pounds for each square kilometre in the continuing part; in respect of the second year sixty-five pounds, and similarly by annual increments of twenty-five pounds until an annual sum of two hundred and ninety pounds will be payable for each square kilometre comprised in the licensed area.
- (3) A royalty at the rate of twelve and a half per cent by value, from which may be deducted the periodic payments mentioned in (2) above.
