The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 8 (5) of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz.: The Import Duties (Process) (No. 2) Order, 1965.

This order, made under Section 8 (5) of the Import Duties Act 1958, provides that certain rayon fabric sent abroad in order to be processed by dipping in a solution of latex and resorcinol formaldehyde resin and by heating will be chargeable on its return with Customs duty in respect of the increased value attributable to the process only.

The Order comes into operation on the 6th October, 1965, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1965 No. 1748.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922 TO 1943

And whereas it appears to me, the said Minister, that the publication or continued publication or distribution of the newspaper hereafter in this Order specified is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland:

Now, therefore, I, The Right Honourable Robert William Brian McConnell, M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1922 to 1943, and the said Regulation 8, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the publication and distribution of the newspaper entitled:

"THE UNITED IRISHMAN"

under that title or under any other title or description whatever, or any part of the said newspaper, shall be, and is hereby, prohibited in Northern Ireland until the 31st day of December, 1968.
