TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 1, and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz:— The Import Duties (General) (No. 1) Order, 1966.

This Order

- (1) deletes from Chapter 48 a subheading—48.09 (A)—for flaxboard which is no longer required since all flaxboard is properly classifiable in subheading 44.18(A);
- (2) provides for the following amendments consequential on corrigenda to the Brussels Nomenclature approved by the Customs Co-operation Council:
 - (a) amendment of Note 2(A) to Section XI to make it clear that the note applies only to mixed woven fabrics
 - (b) amendment of heading 59.03, and consequential amendment to subheadings 59.04(A) and (B), to make it clear that bonded yarn fabrics as well as bonded fibre fabrics are classifiable under this heading
 - (c) amendment of heading 98.07 to make it clear that certain devices for printing or embossing labels are classifiable under this heading. A new subheading has also been raised to preserve the existing rate of duty on these goods;

- (3) provides for amendments of subheadings to headings 84.45, 84.48 and 84.59 consequent upon a change in the classification of strip coilers of a kind used in rolling mills, and parts thereof.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5, to the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz:— The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 1) Order 1966.

This Order

- (i) continues the allowance of drawback of import duty on the exportation of certain imported hand-operated appliances for making labels or name plates following the reclassification of the goods in the Customs Tariff 1959 by the Import Duties (General) (No. 1) Order 1966;
- (ii) provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on the exportation of single vision ophthalmic lenses, other than contact lenses, manufactured from specified imported sheet glass; and

(iii) varies the rates of drawback of import duty on the exportation of:

- (a) specified animal block manufactured from certain imported bones, and
- (b) specified hazelnut products manufactured from certain imported hazelnuts.

The Order comes into operation on the 3rd February, 1966, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1966, No. 61.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 16 of the Post Office Act 1953, viz: The Postal Packets (Customs and Excise) Regulations 1966.

These Regulations, which set out the customs requirements relating to incoming and outgoing postal packets and to goods contained in them, revoke and supersede the Postal Packets (Customs and Excise) Regulations 1962. The provisions of the 1962 Regulations are reproduced in the present Regulations with certain amendments. These amendments are mainly consequential upon amendments to the Universal Postal Convention to which the United Kingdom is a party.

The principal changes are:

- (1) Dutiable goods may no longer be imported by the sample packet service.
- (2) Dutiable goods of certain descriptions may be contained in a Phonopost packet.
- (3) Mail bags containing certain bulk postings of dutiable goods in printed packets must have a green label in the prescribed form affixed to the mail bag label.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st February, 1966, and has been published as Statutory Instrument 1966, No. 66.
