PLANNING ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1931 and 1944

Clokey against the decision of the Donaghadee Urban District Council of his application for permission to erect luxury flats at The Warren, Warren Road, Donaghadee, Co. Down.

BELFAST-DUNGANNON MOTORWAY (M.1)

The Ministry of Development proposes to provide a connection between the Belfast-Dungannon Motorway and the second-class road B.2 in the townlands of Aghacommon, Kilvergan, Ballynacor and Carn, Co. Armagh, to enable west-bound traffic to leave the Motorway and to permit authorised traffic travelling eastwards to enter the Motorway. It is intended that this connection together with part of B.2 itself, will become a trunk road. As part of the scheme it is also proposed to undertake a number of minor road works and to vary a provision relating to a local road in the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road (Moira to Birches) Order 1962.

In connection with these proposals and in accordance with the provisions of Schedule 1 to the Special Roads Act (Northern Ireland) 1963, the Ministry hereby gives notice that it proposes to make an Order under Sections 1, 2, 5, 7, 8, 16 and 26 of the Act. The general purport of the intended Order is :

- 1. to designate as a special road part of the lengths of new road which will provide a connection between the Belfast-Dungannon Motorway and route B.2;
- 2. to provide that the Ministry will be the road authority for the said special road;
- 3. to provide that the following lengths of road will become the Ballynacor-Portadown-Armagh Trunk Road (T.5):
 - (i) the lengths of new road which will connect the Motorway to route B.2;
 - (ii) that section of route B.2 from the point of its intersection with the Motorway connecting road to its junction with the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road; and
 - (iii) that part of the existing Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road between its junction with route B.2 and its junction with the existing Portadown-Armagh Trunk Road in Portadown;
- 4. to authorise the Ministry:
 - (i) to stop-up routes B.2 and C.158 at points where they will meet the Motorway connecting road;

- (ii) to stop-up route C.158 at the points where it will meet the Belfast-Dungannon Motorway;
- (iii) to construct two lengths of road to con-nect routes B.2 and C.158 to the Motorway connecting road;
- (iv) to construct a short length of road between routes B.2 and C.158 for pedestrian use only; and
- (v) to transfer to Armagh County Council the new lengths of road referred to at (iii) and (iv) above as from their dates of completion;
- 5. to provide that only traffic of the types defined in Clauses I and II of Schedule 3 of the Special Roads Act (N.I.) 1963 will be authorised to use that part of the Motorway connecting road referred to at 1 above; and
- to revoke a provision of the Belfast-Ballygawley-Londonderry Trunk Road (Moira to Birches) Order 1962 (S.R. & O. 1962 No. 201) which authorised the Ministry to construct a bridge to carry route C.158 over the Motorway.
