This Order:

- (1) introduces a subheading under heading 17.02 to restore the duty free rate to high test, invert or fancy molasses, following a change of classification brought about by a Classification Opinion of the Customs Co-operation Council;
- (2) amends subheading 18.06 (C)(1) to remove a difficulty in classifying various chocolate preparations with salt in them;
- (3) amends heading 59.07 in conformity with a corrigendum to the Brussels Nomenclature approved by the Customs Co-operation Council so as to enable certain knitted fabrics to be classified under this heading.

PERFORMING RIGHT TRIBUNAL
