- NOTE 1: Where no charge is stated in Columns 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 in relation to a particular country, the particular service or facility is not provided in relation to calls to that country.
- Note 2: This is a booking charge in respect of an application for a call to a specified name and address for the specified purpose of communication with any telephone number at that address (not being a call of the kind mentioned in column 3 or 5).

### NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT, 1952

To: SOPARWY, address unknown.

30.9.1966.

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely one Plymouth Plaza Motor Car, Registration Number 40838. has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that

- (1) in or about June 1965 the said vehicle being imported goods chargeable with a duty of customs were without payment of that duty brought across the boundary into Northern Ireland; and
- (2) in or about June 1965 the said goods being goods chargeable with a duty of customs were allowed to be delivered without payment of that duty on condition that they would be re-exported in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 4 of the Temporary Importation (Private Vehicles Vessels and Aircraft) Regulations 1961 (S.I.
