The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958 viz.: The Import Duties (General) (No. 8) Order, 1966.

This Order makes two amendments in the Customs Tariff consequential upon clarifications approved by the Customs Co-operation Council in the English text of the Brussels Nomenclature. It amends:

- (a) paragraph (c) of the note to Chapter 2 to make it clear that animal fat classified in Chapter 2 includes only animal fat of the type covered by heading 02.05;
- (b) note 6(b) to section XI to make clear the meaning of the expression "made up" in relation to certain textile goods.

It also amends heading 90.25 of the Customs Tariff to preserve the previous rate of import duty on environmental test chambers following their re-classification under this heading.

The Order comes into operation on the 6th October, 1966, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1966 No. 1219.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Sections 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Import Duties Act, 1958, and Section 2(5) of the Finance Act, 1965, viz.: The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 8) Order, 1966.

This Order:

- (1) provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on the exportation:
 - (a) of furniture manufactured from certain imported wood; and
 - (b) of sebacic acid manufactured from imported castor oil;
- (2) in the case of the following exported goods, namely:
 - (a) castor oil manufactured from imported castor seed;
 - (b) chewing gum and chewing confectionery manufactured from imported chewing gum base;
 - (c) handbags and certain other leather goods manufactured from certain imported leather;
 - (d) hazelnut products manufactured from imported hazelnuts; and
 - (e) sperm oil refined from imported unrefined sperm oil,
 provides, by revoking existing fixed rates of drawback, for drawback of import duty related to the duty paid on the imported goods actually used in the manufacture of the exported goods and in the case of the goods specified in sub-paragraphs (c) and (e) above, removes the condition for drawback that duty shall have been paid at not less than a specified rate;
- (3) varies the rate of drawback of import duty in respect of the following exported goods:
 - (a) animal black of certain descriptions manufactured from certain imported bones;
 - (b) apricot kernel products manufactured from certain imported apricot kernels;
 - (c) cigarette papers in the form of booklets manufactured from certain imported cigarette paper; and
 - (d) certain soya bean oil manufactured from imported soya beans;
- (4) corrects the description of certain imported woods used in the manufacture of exported veneer sheets to conform, with the Customs Tariff.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT, 1966

Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes

Distribution Costs of Fresh Fruit and Vegetables

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has had discussions with the National Federation of Fruit and Potato Trades Ltd. about their recommendation to their members to introduce a surcharge on sales of not less than either 2d. in the £ or 2d. per package to cover rising costs and increased taxation. These discussions took place in the light of the White Paper on the Prices and Incomes Standstill (Cmnd. 3073) and of representations by the Retail Fruit Trade Federation Ltd.

Arising out of these discussions, the National Federation requested that there should be an inquiry by the National Board for Prices and Incomes into the distribution of fresh fruit and vegetables, and the Retail Fruit Trade Federation supported this. The First Secretary of State and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food consider that this would be desirable, and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has asked that the surcharge by wholesalers on fruit and vegetables sales in respect of costs that could not be absorbed should not exceed 1d. in the £ pending a report by the Board.

Accordingly, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act, 1966, the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the question of the costs and profit margins of the wholesale and retail fruit and vegetable trades. 3rd October, 1966.
