### ANCIENT MONUMENTS

Whereas by Section 5, sub-section 1, of the Ancient Monuments Act (Northern Ireland) 1926, as amended by the Ancient Monuments Act (Northern Ireland) 1937, it is enacted that the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") shall from time to time cause to be prepared and published a list, or lists, containing:

- (a) such monuments as are reported by the Ancient Monuments Advisory Council as being ancient monuments, the preservation of which is of national importance; and
- (b) such other ancient monuments as the Ministry thinks fit.

Now in pursuance of the aforesaid Section, the Ministry hereby publishes the following addition to the lists of ancient monuments, the preservation of which is of national importance:

#### COUNTY ANTRIM

The earthworks known as Dunmurry Mound and Fort situate in the Townland of Dunmurry.
