PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Distribution Costs of Fresh Fruit and Vegetables

Direction Under Section 5(4) Extending the Period Within Which the National Board for Prices and Incomes Must Publish Their Report

Whereas the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 6th October 1966;

2. And whereas by Section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to Section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. Now therefore the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in pursuance of their powers under the said Section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be extended by two months.

OFFICE AND SHOP PREMISES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966

The Ministry of Health and Social Services hereby gives notice that in pursuance of section 75 of, and Schedule 1 to, the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966, it proposes to make special regulations under that Act. The Regulations will modify the application of section 29 of the Act (Fire precautions—certification of premises) to certain buildings in which there are office or shop premises and also a factory (or part of a factory) within the meaning of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965.

The draft regulations entitled the Office and Shop Premises (Modification of Fire Certification) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967, have been prepared and will be made under section 29(9) of the Act. Copies of the draft regulations may be obtained from the Ministry of Health and Social Services, Public Health No. 4 Branch, Room 932, Dundonald House, Belfast, 4.

Any objection to the draft regulations by or on behalf of persons affected must be sent to the Ministry at the above address on or before 1st February 1967.

Every objection must be in writing and state:

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1965

Notice is hereby given that on the 29th December 1966, the Ministry of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Sections 75 and 179(3) and (4) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965, made regulations entitled the Power Presses Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966, which will come into operation on 2nd October 1967.

These regulations contain requirements in relation to the use of power presses (other than when used or to be used for working hot metal) in factories and electrical stations to which the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965 applies. Such requirements are additional to those imposed by the said Act of 1965. The regulations provide that only competent and properly trained persons shall prepare power presses for use; for the periodical examination of power presses and their safety devices; for the inspection and test of safety devices after the tools have been set or re-set and before or during each working shift; for the marking of power presses and safety devices for purposes of identification; and for the marking on every power press constructed after the coming into operation of these regulations of the maximum permissible speed and the direction of rotation of the flywheel.
