A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING A NEW DESIGN FOR SILVER AND CUPRO-NICKEL CROWN PIECES AND MAKING THE SAID CROWN PIECES CURRENT AND LEGAL TENDER IN GIBRALTAR.

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas by virtue of Proclamations issued under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1946 certain parts of those Acts are in force in Gibraltar:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine a new design, hereinafter specified, for the silver Crown, being one of the silver coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act 1870 and for the cupro-nickel Crown, being one of the cupro-nickel coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act 1946, to be struck at Our Mint in London, and to order that the said Crowns shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar:

We, therefore, in pursuance of section eleven of the Coinage Act 1870 and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

1. There shall be coined, from time to time, at Our Mint in London silver Crowns and cupro-nickel Crowns of the following design:

For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH II D.G. REGINA" and for the reverse a triple towered castle with a key suspended therefrom by a chain with the inscription "GIBRALTAR ONE CROWN" and the date "1967" split on either side of the key. The coin shall have a graining of the edge.

2. The said coins shall be current, and be legal tender, within Gibraltar.
3. This Proclamation shall come into force on the date of its promulgation in Gibraltar by the Governor and Commander-in-Chief thereof.

Now, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council and in pursuance of section eleven of the Coinage Act 1870 and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, We do hereby call in the coins specified in Schedule 1 to this Proclamation from the territories specified in Schedule 2 thereto by the first day of November One thousand nine hundred and sixty-seven, and We do proclaim, declare and direct that after the said date the said coins shall not be current or legal tender in those territories.

Station, Musgrave Street, Belfast, 1, such notice to be received within 21 days of the date of seizure, or, where notice of the seizure is published in the Belfast Gazette, within ten days of such publication, whichever period shall terminate the later.

If no such claim is received as aforesaid the said Order provides that the livestock shall be deemed to be condemned as forfeited.
