WHEREAS by Section 29, Sub-section 2, of the Widows', Orphans', and Old-Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, it is provided that an Umpire may be appointed by the Governor of Northern Ireland for the purposes of that Act:

And whereas it is desirable that an Umpire should be appointed for Northern Ireland:

Now, therefore, I James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by that Act do hereby appoint John Edmond Warnock, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Umpire for the purposes of the said Act, for one year from this date.

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator by Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921-23, I hereby prescribe the 31st day of March, 1926, as the final date by which

(a) Proofs by British nationals to whom an extension of time may be granted under

the second paragraph of the Rule issued by me, dated the 7th March, 1923, in respect of debts due to them by Hungarian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Hungarian Government under Article 231 of the Treaty of Trianon.

(b) Claims by British nationals against the Hungarian Government with the payment of which the property, rights, and interests within His Majesty's Dominions or Protectorates belonging to nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary at the date when the said Treaty came into force (not being property, rights, or interests acquired under any general licence issued by or on behalf of His Majesty), and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation, or other dealings therewith are charged by Article 1 (ix) of the above-mentioned Orders in Council,

must be made upon the prescribed Forms and lodged with this Department in order to rank for payment of the fifth dividend to be declared by me out of the funds in my hands arising from the liquidation of the above-mentioned property, rights, and interests belonging to nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary or received by me from the Hungarian Clearing Office under paragraph 11 of the Annex to Article 231 of the above-mentioned Treaty in pursuance of the Agreement between His Majesty's Government and the Hungarian Government of the 20th December, 1921, respecting the settlement of Enemy Debts referred to in Section III of Part X of the above-mentioned Treaty, or arising out of any other available property.

NOTE.—The cost of Reserved Services and the contribution towards Imperial Expenditure are deducted from the proceeds of Reserved Taxes. The net sum due, viz., the Residuary Share of Reserved Taxes, is paid over to the Northern Government by the Imperial Treasury one month in arrear.

* The duty of issuing Loans and Advances for these purposes was transferred on 20th October, 1925, from the Exchequer to the Government Loans Fund. This Fund also makes advances to the Exchequer for Housing Grants and Erection, etc., of Police Barracks, being recouped by means of Annuities included in Supply Services.

WHEREAS by Section 83 of "The County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877," it is provided that the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the Chairmen or any five of them to be selected or nominated as in the said Act provided, and with the consent of the Treasury may by Order fix the fees to be taken in the Civil Bill Courts in respect of any business under that or any other Acts in force for the time being in such Courts, and may, with the like concurrence and consent, alter, reduce or increase the same from time to time, and may also, with the like concurrence and consent, alter the fees and Stamp duties taken in those Courts and substitute other fees for the same.

AND WHEREAS under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the Orders made by His Majesty in Council thereunder, the references in the said Section to the Lord Chancellor shall be construed as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, and the references to the Treasury shall be construed as references to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland.

AND WHEREAS by the County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, Section 10, the concurrence required in connection with the making by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland of Rules or Orders under Section eighty-three of the County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877, shall be the concurrence of the Chairmen within the meaning of the said Act, or any two of them to be nominated by the said Lord Chief Justice.

AND WHEREAS by Order dated 1st day of February, 1926, the Right Honourable William Moore, Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, made pursuant to the provisions of Section 10 of the said County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, did nominate His Honor Herbert Thompson, Recorder of Belfast, County Court Judge and Chairman of Antrim, and His Honor Arthur Henry Bates, County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Down, to be the two Chairmen whose concurrence with the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland in the making of Rules or Orders and in framing of Scales of Fees, Costs and Charges under the said County Officers and Courts Act, 1877, should be necessary and sufficient.

NOW I, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE WILLIAM MOORE, Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, with the concurrence of HIS HONOR HERBERT THOMPSON, Recorder of Belfast and County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Antrim, and of HIS HONOR ARTHUR HENRY BATES, County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Down, and with the consent of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, DO HEREBY fix the fees set out in the Schedule hereto as the fees to be taken in the Civil Bill Courts in Northern Ireland on and after the 1st day of May, 1926, in respect of any business under the County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877, and under any other Acts in force for the time being in such Courts.

AND I DO FURTHER ORDER, with the concurrence and consent aforesaid, that all Orders fixing such fees in the said Courts heretofore made be and the same are hereby annulled and revoked as from the said 1st day of May, 1926.
