And whereas certain Rules of Court entitled "The Rules of the Supreme Court (Ireland), 1905," are in force in Northern Ireland under and subject to the provisions aforesaid and as altered from time to time by the Lord Lieutenant and the said Governor by Orders in Council.

And whereas on the 11th day of January, 1926, a majority of all the Judges of the said

Supreme Court of Judicature and the other persons upon whose recommendation the said Governor may make, alter or annul Rules of Court as respects Northern Ireland present at a meeting for that purpose held (of which majority the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland was one) have passed the resolution set out in the Schedule hereto for the making of a Rule of Court in order to alter Order LXII, Rule 71, in the manner appearing in the said Schedule.

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matter to which the said first-mentioned Rule relates that the same should come into operation forthwith.

ORDER LVIII A.

APPEALS TO THE COURT OF APPEAL FROM ANY ORDER OF THE LAND PURCHASE COMMISSION, NORTHERN IRELAND.

5. Further evidence shall be admitted on the hearing of any such appeal on special grounds only, and not without special leave of the Court of Appeal.

Appeal. 6. The provisions of Order LVIII, except so far as inconsistent with the terms of this Order, shall apply to all appeals under the said Act.
