### H.M. TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Import Duties Act 1958, and Section 2(5) of the Finance Act 1965.

Viz.—The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 1) Order 1968.

This Order revokes the existing fixed rate of drawback of import duty for the following exported goods manufactured from the imported materials shown and provides for the drawback to be related to the duty paid on the quantity of the imported materials actually used in their manufacture :

### POST OFFICE

#### WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACT 1949

The Postmaster General hereby gives notice to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (Including Television)—General Form" (under paragraph 7 of the Schedule thereto), to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (Including Television)—Multiple Form" (under paragraph 7 of the First Schedule thereto) and to all holders of "Broadcast Receiving Licences (Including Television)—Hotel Comprehensive Form" (under paragraph 7 of the First Schedule thereto) that on and from the 8th February 1968 the terms of the said Licences are hereby varied as follows :

- (1) Clause 1(b) thereof shall be varied so as to read as follows :  
 "to use the said apparatus for the purposes of receiving  
 (i) visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the said apparatus in monochrome only and messages sent by telephony from authorised Broadcasting Stations for general reception, and  
 (ii) visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the said apparatus in monochrome only and messages sent by telephony or telegraphy from licensed amateur stations."
- (2) The following clause shall be added at the end thereof :  
 "This licence does not authorise the use of

any apparatus for the purpose of receiving visual images sent by television which can be exhibited by the apparatus otherwise than in monochrome."

Note.—A fresh licence is required authorising the reception of television in colour.

## DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AFFAIRS

### PRICES AND INCOMES ACTS 1966 AND 1967

*Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes of an Agreement and an Award relating to terms and conditions of employment in the road passenger transport industry and notice of a direction in relation thereto under section 15 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 and section 2 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967*

The Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Ministers of Labour and Transport (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the said Ministers"), acting jointly in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for their report the following Agreement and Award, that is to say:

- (a) the Agreement providing for increases with effect from the first full pay period following 14th December 1967 in the rates of pay of all adult employees in the road passenger transport industry previously covered by the National Joint Industrial Council for the road passenger transport industry, made on 14th December 1967 between the Federation of Municipal Passenger Transport Employers on the one hand and the Transport and General Workers' Union and the National Union of General and Municipal Workers on the other, and ratified by the National Joint Industrial Council for the road passenger transport industry on 11th January 1968; and
- (b) the Award made on 22nd January 1968 whereby the Nottingham City Council by its Transport Committee resolved to implement the terms of the said Agreement referred to in paragraph (a) above with effect from the pay week beginning on 4th February 1968.

By virtue of the aforesaid reference, the said Ministers, acting jointly in pursuance of their powers under section 15(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 as extended by section 2 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967, hereby direct that the said section 15 shall apply:

1. to the Agreement specified in paragraph (a) above by reference to 14th December, 1967, and
2. to the Award specified in paragraph (b) above by reference to the 22nd January, 1968.

Note.—This reference and direction were notified in the London Gazette on 27th January, 1968, and take effect on that date.

The direction that section 15 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 shall apply results in a standstill on the implementation of the Agreement and Award referred to in the direction until the publication (not later than three months from the said date) of the Board's report on the reference.

The standstill in the case of the Agreement applies by reference back to 14th December 1967 which is the date on which the Agreement was made and in the case of the Award by reference back to 22nd January 1968 which is the date on which it was made.

It should also be noted that, by virtue of section 1 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1967, the standstill may continue beyond the publication of the Board's report if it should contain a recommendation adverse in any respect to the implementation of the Agreement or, as the case may be, of the Award.

## Report of the National Board for Prices and Incomes

### COSTS AND CHARGES IN THE RADIO AND TELEVISION RENTAL AND RELAY INDUSTRY

On 24th January 1967, in pursuance of their powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Technology referred the question of Costs and Charges in the Radio and Television Rental and Relay Industry to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination.
