DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT AND PRODUCTIVITY

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Reference to the National Board for Prices
and Incomes

STEEL PRICES

As stated by the Prime Minister in September 1967, the Government has decided to refer all major price increases in the nationalised industries to the National Board for Prices and Incomes.

The British Steel Corporation have consulted the Minister of Power about proposals for a new price structure, and new price levels, for iron and steel products produced by the nationalised steel industry. These changes would also have repercussions on the

private sector of the industry, as both customer of, and competitor with, the nationalised sector, and it is understood that private sector companies may wish to make increases in their prices.

Accordingly, in pursuance of powers under section 2 of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Minister of Power hereby refer the Corporation's proposals to the Board for examination against the background of the Government's policies for nationalised industries as set out in Cmnd. 3437, and taking into account the effect of those proposals on the U.K. steel industry as a whole. The Board is also requested to advise whether and to what extent it would be appropriate for the private sector companies simultaneously to align their prices with any new prices introduced by the Corporation.

MANUFACTURERS' PRICES OF TOILET PREPARATIONS

The First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Board of Trade, consider that the manufacturers' prices of toilet preparations should be examined by the National Board for Prices and Incomes.

Accordingly, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Board of Trade, hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the question of manufacturers' prices in the toilet preparations industry.

Top Salaries in the Private Sector and Nationalised Industries

DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 5(4) FURTHER EXTENDING THE PERIOD WITHIN WHICH THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES MUST PUBLISH THEIR REPORT

Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Chancellor of the Exchequer, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 2nd July 1968;

2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. And whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Chancellor of the Exchequer, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), by a direction published in the Gazette on 17th September 1968 extended the said period of three months by three months.

4. Now, therefore, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Chancellor of the Exchequer, in pursuance of their powers under the said section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be further extended by three months.

Reference to the National Board for Prices and Incomes of an award relating to the salaries and job maxima of certain staff employees of the Imperial Chemical Industries Limited

Imperial Chemical Industries Limited have notified a proposal to increase staff salary levels and job maxima. In justification of this proposal the Company have submitted evidence of increased productivity and a reduction in recent years of their price index.

The First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, acting in pursuance of her powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 hereby refers to the

National Board for Prices and Incomes for their examination and report the award made by Imperial Chemical Industries Limited providing, with effect from 1st January 1969, for an increase of 6 per cent. in the salary levels and job maxima of certain staff employed by the said Company.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922 TO 1943

Whereas by Regulation 8 of the regulations to which the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1922 to 1943 apply (being a regulation made by the Minister of Home Affairs and having effect and to be enforced in like manner as regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland) 1922) it is provided that if it appears to the Minister of Home Affairs that the publication or continued publication of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland the said Minister may by Order prohibit for any specified period the publication of any such newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter:

And Whereas it is further provided by the said Regulation that if any person shall, within such specified period, print, publish, circulate or distribute or be in any way concerned in the printing, publication, circulation or distribution of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter, the publication of which has been prohibited under the said Regulation; he shall be guilty of an offence against the regulations to which the aforesaid Acts apply:

And Whereas it appears to me, the said Minister, that the publication or continued publication or distribution of the newspaper hereafter in this Order specified is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland:

Now, Therefore, I, Captain The Right Honourable William Joseph Long, J.P., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1922 to 1943, and the said Regulation 8, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, Do Hereby order that the publication and distribution of the newspaper entitled—

"THE UNITED IRISHMAN"

under that title or under any other title or description whatever, or any part of the said newspaper, shall be, and is hereby, prohibited in Northern Ireland until the 31st day of December, 1971.

THE IMPORTED FOOD (NORTHERN IRELAND) REGULATIONS 1968

Austria: Official Certificate

The Ministry of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968, it hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificate, of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto, as showing:

- (a) that the meat to which it relates, or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country or origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry; and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

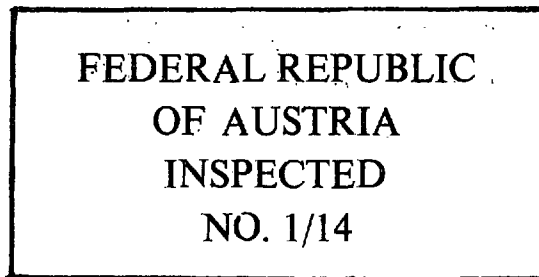
The said Official Certificate is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) This recognition applies only to meat and meat products imported into Northern Ireland from Austria but does not apply to any such meat or meat products derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where the Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed, or otherwise marked, on the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product.
- (iii) Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent indicated in the Second Schedule hereto.

The Notices published in the London Gazettes dated 30th January, 1951, 29th May, 1964, and 18th December, 1964, and the Notice published in the Belfast Gazette dated 9th March, 1951, are hereby revoked.
