CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922 TO 1943

Whereas by Regulation 8 of the regulations to which the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1922 to 1943 apply (being a regulation made by the Minister of Home Affairs and having effect and to be enforced in like manner as regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland) 1922) it is provided that if it appears to the Minister of Home Affairs that the publication or continued publication of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland the said Minister may by Order prohibit for any specified period the publication of any such newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter:

And Whereas it is further provided by the said Regulation that if any person shall, within such specified period, print, publish, circulate or distribute or be in any way concerned in the printing, publication, circulation or distribution of any newspaper, periodical, book, circular or other printed matter, the publication of which has been prohibited under the said Regulation; he shall be guilty of an offence against the regulations to which the aforesaid Acts apply:

And Whereas it appears to me, the said Minister, that the publication or continued publication or distribution of the newspaper hereafter in this Order specified is prejudicial to or likely to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace and the maintenance of order in Northern Ireland:

Now, Therefore, I, Captain The Right Honourable William Joseph Long, J.P., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1922 to 1943, and the said Regulation 8, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, Do Hereby order that the publication and distribution of the newspaper entitled—

"THE UNITED IRISHMAN"

under that title or under any other title or description whatever, or any part of the said newspaper, shall be, and is hereby, prohibited in Northern Ireland until the 31st day of December, 1971.

THE IMPORTED FOOD (NORTHERN IRELAND) REGULATIONS 1968

Austria: Official Certificate

The Ministry of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968, it hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificate, of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto, as showing:

- (a) that the meat to which it relates, or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country or origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry; and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Official Certificate is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) This recognition applies only to meat and meat products imported into Northern Ireland from Austria but does not apply to any such meat or meat products derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where the Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed, or otherwise marked, on the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product.
- (iii) Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent indicated in the Second Schedule hereto.
