Switzerland : Official Certificate

- Where the Certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Official Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the package containing the meat or meat product.
