SUPREME COURT NORTHERN IRELAND

PROCEDURE

The Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (No.. 1) 1969

Notice is hereby given that on 1st January, 1969, the Northern Ireland Supreme Court Rules Committee in exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Northern Ireland Act 1962, made the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (No. 1) 1969 S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1969 No. 1.

These Rules amend the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) 1936. Rule 1 specifies the documents which must be lodged when entering an action for trial.

Rule 2 revokes Order XLIV, which relates to attachment, and substitutes a new Order XLIV which provides for the punishment for contempt of court by an order of committal. Where the Court decides to imprison a person for contempt of court it will do so by making an order of committal whatever the nature of the contempt. A writ of attachment will no longer be used. A single Judge of the High Court may exercise the jurisdiction of the High Court to make an order of committal as provided in rule 1(2) of the new Order. The special cases in which an order for committal may be made in private and the procedure for stating in open court the terms of any order so made, are provided by rule 4 of the Order.

The amendments made by rules 1 and 2 and rule 4, which amends the definition of "Undefended cause" in Order LXX, come into force on 3rd January, 1969.

Rules 3 and 5 amend Order LXVI and Order LXXXVIII. The amendments provide for the use in the Supreme Court of the international standard paper size A4 instead of the foolscap size which is used at present. These amending rules come into force on 1st July, 1969.
