GREY OF NAUNTON  
A PROCLAMATION

*Declaring that the First Monday in August in the Year 1969 shall not be a Bank Holiday or a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland and appointing the First Monday in September of that Year in its stead*

Whereas it is considered inexpedient that the First Monday in August should be a Bank Holiday in the year 1969.

Now, Therefore, I, Ralph Francis Alnwick, Baron Grey of Naunton, Knight Grand Cross of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Officer of the Order of the British Empire, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 5 of the Bank Holidays Act 1871, Section 3 of the Holidays Extension Act 1875, and of every power Me thereunto enabling, do hereby declare and appoint as follows:

1. In the year 1969 the first Monday in August shall not be a Bank Holiday and instead the first Monday in September shall be a Bank Holiday.
2. In this Proclamation the expression "Bank Holiday" shall include a public holiday in the Inland Revenue Offices and a holiday in the Customs and Excise.

Given at Government House, Hillsborough, this twentieth day of January in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-nine.

### SYNTHETIC ORGANIC DYESTUFFS AND ORGANIC PIGMENTS PRICES
