PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Report by the National Board for Prices and Incomes

PAY AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE OF ENGINEERING WORKERS (FINAL REPORT)

On 12th May, 1967, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and the Minister of Labour referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination

- the working of the current engineering longterm agreement, including its effect on earnings levels and differentials, productivity, costs and prices, and
- (2) the pay and conditions of service of supervisory, clerical, technical and similar workers in the engineering industry.

The Board has now make its final report on these questions and in accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that this report was first published as Command Paper Number 3931 on 20th February, 1969.

MAN-MADE FIBRE AND COTTON YARN PRICES

The Board of Trade have been notified under the early warning arrangements of proposals to increase prices of certain unprocessed viscose rayon textile (filament) yarns. In December, 1968, the prices of certain processed viscose and acetate rayon textile (filament) yarns were raised, and there were increases in many prices for cotton and man-made fibre yarns spun on the cotton system. The First Secretary of State and the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Board of Trade consider it desirable that these actual and proposed price increases should be examined by the National Board for Prices and Incomes.

Accordingly, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Board of Trade, hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the question of manufacturers, prices of viscose and acetate rayon textile (filament) yarns, and of cotton, man-made fibre and mixture yarns spun on the cotton system.

BELFAST - BALLYGAWLEY - LONDONDERRY TRUNK ROAD (T.3)

Changes in the Trunk Road System following completion of Motorway M.1 from Verner's Bridge to Stangmore

THE IMPORTED FOOD (NORTHERN IRELAND) REGULATIONS 1968

Denmark: Official Certificate

The Ministry of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968, it hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, each of the Official Certificates, of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto as showing:

- (a) that the meat to which it relates, or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry, and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

Each of the said Official Certificates is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) This recognition applies only to meat and meat products imported into Northern Ireland from Denmark but does not apply to any such meat or meat products derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where Official Certificates are in the form of labels, the recognition will apply only if the labels are securely affixed to the meat or meat product or the package containing the meat or meat product and if the labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificates.
- (iii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of stamps, the recognition will apply only if the stamps are clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or meat product or the package containing the meat or meat product.
- (iv) Recognition of the Official Certificates is extended to include meat described in Part II of the First Schedule hereto.
- (v) Recognition of the Official Certificates is restricted to the extent indicated in the Second Schedule hereto.
- All existing notices in respect of Official Certificates relating to Denmark are hereby revoked.
