PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Wages and conditions in the Electrical Contracting Industry

DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 5(4) EXTENDING THE PERIOD WITHIN WHICH THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES MUST PUBLISH THEIR REPORT

1. Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, in pursuance of her powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and has published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 13th December 1968;
2. And whereas by section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;
3. Now, therefore, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, in pursuance of her powers under the said section 5(4), hereby directs that the said period of three months be extended by three months.

PRICES OF NON-ALLOY BRIGHT STEEL BARS

A private producer of non-alloy bright steel bars has made a proposal to the Minister of Power for an increase in the prices of this product. The Minister considered that other producers may also wish to increase their prices. There is a close relationship between the prices of non-alloy bright steel bars and the prices of some of the products included in the proposals of the British Steel Corporation which are already being examined by the National Board for Prices and Incomes.

Accordingly, in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Minister of Power, hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes the question of the prices of non-alloy bright steel bars, taking into account the proposals made to the Minister which are the subject of the Board's enquiry into steel prices generally in accordance with terms of reference published in the Gazette on 24th December 1968.

Gas Applications for Orders Rules 1920
(Statutory Rules and Orders 1920, No. 1826)

Notice of Application for Order

Take Notice that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Lurgan in the County of Armagh being Gas Undertakers within the meaning of the above mentioned Act (hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers") in pursuance of the provisions of Section 1 of the said Act and of the above mentioned Rules have applied to the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland for an Order for the following purposes:

- (1) To repeal the enactments and other provisions set out in Part I of the First Schedule hereto being enactments and provisions requiring the Undertakers to supply gas of a particular illuminating or calorific value and to substitute power for the Undertakers to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas.
- (2) To modify the statutory and other provisions set out in Part II of the First Schedule hereto being provisions which affect the charges which

may be made by the Undertakers by substituting for the maximum price of Seven Shillings and Six Pence per thousand cubic feet to consumers authorised under those provisions the maximum price of Five Shillings per therm for gas supplied by the Undertakers; the calorific value of which being "the declared calorific value" will be 400 British Thermal Units per cubic foot gross.

The description and address of the Undertakers is the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Lurgan acting by the Council of the Borough of Lurgan, Town Hall, Lurgan.

The object of the Application is to enable the Undertakers to adopt the thermal basis of charge and to enable them to supply gas at an economic rate in relation to the increased costs and charges payable by them in respect of materials, labour and maintenance of and incidental to the production and supply of gas by them.

The area of supply is as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
