A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act (Northern Ireland), 1926, it is enacted that if it appears to the Governor of Northern Ireland that any action has been taken, or is likely to be taken in the immediate future (whether in Northern Ireland or elsewhere) by any persons or body of persons, being action of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community in Northern Ireland, or any substantial portion of that community, of the essentials of life, the said Governor may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas in our opinion a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act has arisen:,

Now therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, we, the Lords Justices for the Government of Northern Ireland, do, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

EMERGENCY POWERS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1926.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Lords Justices for the Government of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Emergency Powers Act (Northern Ireland), 1926, and of all other powers thereunto enabling them, have made Regulations entitled the Emergency Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1926. (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1926. No. 43).

This day the Lord Justices appointed for the government of Northern Ireland have given, in the name of and on behalf of His Majesty the King, their Assent to the following Bill, agreed upon by both Houses of the Parliament of Northern Ireland:—

PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with Section 3, Sub-section 2, of the above-mentioned Act, that the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, after consultation with the Minister of Education for Northern Ireland, has approved of the Regulations dated the 15th day of April, 1926, made by the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland under Section 3 of the aforementioned Act.
