Wages and Conditions in the Electrical Contracting Industry

DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 5(4) FURTHER EXTENDING
THE PERIOD WITHIN WHICH THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR
PRICES AND INCOMES MUST PUBLISH THEIR REPORT

THE PAY SETTLEMENT REACHED ON 1st DECEMBER 1968 BETWEEN THE NEWSPAPER PUBLISHERS' ASSOCIATION AND THE NATIONAL UNION OF JOURNALISTS

- (b) a Deed Poll, duly authenticated by the Supreme Court, is produced for inspection at the time the advertisement is submitted.

Advertisements relating to Bills before Parliament will not be inserted unless signed by a Parliamentary Agent or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
