BY THE QUEEN  
A PROCLAMATION  
CALLING IN ALL HALFPENNIES

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas under section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to call in coins of any date or denomination:

And Whereas it now appears to Us desirable to call in all halfpennies:

We, therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council and in pursuance of section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870, do hereby call in by the thirty-first day of July One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine all halfpennies, and direct that after such thirty-first day of July One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine such coins shall not be current or legal tender within Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-fifth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine and in the eighteenth year of Our Reign.

MAN-MADE FIBRE AND COTTON YARN PRICES  
(FIRST REPORT)

On 20th February, 1969, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Board of Trade, referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the question of manufacturers' prices of viscose and acetate rayon textile (filament) yarns, and of cotton, man-made fibre and mixture yarns spun on the cotton system. The Board has now made its first report entitled "Man-Made Fibre and Cotton Yarn Prices".
