WAGES AND CONDITIONS IN THE ELECTRICAL CONTRACTING INDUSTRY

On 13th December 1968, in pursuance of her powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for separate examination and report:

- (1) Wages and conditions of employment in the electrical contracting industries in England, Wales and Northern Ireland;
- (2) Wages and conditions in the Electrical Contracting Industry in Scotland;
- (3) Questions related to (1) and (2) above, including the relationship of national settlements in electrical contracting to other pay settlements and in particular to site agreements.

The Board has now made its report entitled "Pay and Conditions in the Electrical Contracting Industry". In accordance with Section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 4097 on 27th June 1969.

(N.I.) 1967 No. 269 and S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1968 No. 156) so as to impose appropriate requirements and restrictions on the sale of substances which have been added to the Poisons Schedule.

The relevant insurance policy schemes are the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Nurses and Hospital Officers and any other scheme approved for this purpose by the Ministry of Finance.
