Whereas by Section 1 of the Parliamentary Commissioner Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 (which section came into operation on 1st July 1969) the Governor of Northern Ireland may appoint the Northern Ireland Parliamentary Commissioner for Administration:

Now Therefore, I, Ralph Francis Alwick, Baron Grey of Naunton, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor of Northern Ireland, do hereby, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the said Act in that behalf, appoint Sir Edmund Gerald Compton, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, to be the Northern Ireland Parliamentary Commissioner for Administration, to have and to hold the said office during good behaviour with all the powers and duties belonging thereto and in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the Parliamentary Commissioner Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 and all other Statutes in this behalf made and provided.

Given at Government House, Hillsborough, this 1st day of July, 1969, by His Excellency's Command.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz. the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 4) Order, 1969.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporarily exempt from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2 shall continue to be exempt from import duty, both until 1st January 1970, except for items for which an earlier day is specified.

The Order comes into operation on 3rd July, 1969, and has been published as Statutory Instrument 1969 No. 839.

WAGES AND CONDITIONS IN THE ELECTRICAL CONTRACTING INDUSTRY

On 13th December 1968, in pursuance of her powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for separate examination and report:

- (1) Wages and conditions of employment in the electrical contracting industries in England, Wales and Northern Ireland;
- (2) Wages and conditions in the Electrical Contracting Industry in Scotland;
- (3) Questions related to (1) and (2) above, including the relationship of national settlements in electrical contracting to other pay settlements and in particular to site agreements.

The Board has now made its report entitled "Pay and Conditions in the Electrical Contracting Industry". In accordance with Section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 4097 on 27th June 1969.
