#### PLASTERBOARD PRICES

Under the arrangements for early warning of proposed price increases, the Government have been notified by BPB Industries Ltd. of their proposal to increase the price of plasterboard.

The First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Minister of Public Building and Works consider it desirable that the proposed increase in price by BPB Industries Ltd. should be the subject of an independent investigation by the National Board for Prices and Incomes.

Accordingly, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity, and the Minister of Public Building and Works hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the question of the price of plasterboard.

#### PRODUCTIVITY AGREEMENTS

On 26th November 1968, in pursuance of her powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the relationship of improvements in productivity to pay structures, the implications of productivity bargaining for costs, prices and profits, and the evaluation of productivity agreements with particular reference to:

- (i) the potentialities and problems of industry-wide and company-wide productivity framework agreements,
- (ii) the application of productivity measurement and agreements to clerical and other non-manual work,
- (iii) the potentialities and problems of partial agreements covering only certain workers or some issues, and
- (iv) the renewal and later development of existing agreements.

The Board has now made its report entitled "Productivity Agreements". In accordance with section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 4136 on 5th August, 1969.

The Order prohibits the killing of hen pheasant except in special cases where the Minister of Home Affairs considers it expedient to grant exemption and also prohibits the sale or purchase of hen pheasant or partridge for consumption in Northern Ireland or elsewhere by human beings or animals at any time during the operation of the Order.

The Order permits those persons who have been granted exemption to kill hen pheasants to sell the birds killed under the terms of the exemption to a licensed game dealer.

## SUPREME COURT RULES COMMITTEE

SUPREME COURT, NORTHERN IRELAND

*Procedure*

THE RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT (NORTHERN IRELAND) (No. 3) 1969

Notice is hereby given that on 27th June, 1969, the Northern Ireland Supreme Court Rules Committee in exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Northern Ireland Act 1962, with the concurrence of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, made the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (No. 3) 1969, S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1969, No. 187.

These Rules, which come into force on 1st September, 1969, make certain changes relating to costs in respect of contentious business and Bankruptcy by amending Orders LXV and LXXXVIII and Appendix S of the Rules of the Supreme Court. The principal changes are:

- the codification and amendment of the various bases of taxation,
- a general increase in the amount of the costs which may be allowed under Part I of Appendix S, which relates to contentious business, and under Part V of Appendix S, which relates to Bankruptcy, with an extension of the discretionary powers of the Taxing Master, and
- the elimination of all but one of the different bases of taxation as between solicitor and client, the one retained being that where costs are payable out of a fund in which the client and others are interested. (Order LXV rule 61(29)).

The amendments made by these rules apply in relation to causes or matters commenced on or after 1st September, 1969.
