Notice is hereby given pursuant to Rule 5 of the Performing Right Tribunal Rules 1965 of a reference to the Tribunal under Section 26 of the Copyright Act 1956 by The Performing Right Society Limited of Copyright House, 29/33 Berners Street, London, W.1 (hereinafter referred to as the Licensing Body) and Cinema Exhibitors' Association of Great Britain and Ireland of 22/25 Dean Street, London, W.1., and the Association of Independent Cinemas Limited of Regency House, Warwick Street, London, W.1., (hereinafter referred to as "the Interested Parties").

The Reference concerns a licence scheme of the Licensing Body regulating the terms and conditions on which the Licensing Body will issue licenses

authorising the public performance of copyright music within its repertoire at cinemas in the course of the exhibition of cinematographic films (hereinafter referred to as "Tariff "C""). This scheme was embodied in an Order made by the Tribunal dated 6th April, 1961 which was varied by a subsequent Order dated 21st January, 1963.

The Disputes which caused Tariff "C" to be referred to the Tribunal in the previous proceedings were not concerned in any way with the formula for calculating the royalty payable to the Licensing Body under licenses issued pursuant to Tariff "C". The formula was arrived at by negotiation between the Licensing Body and the two interested parties and was incorporated in formal agreements dated 17th December, 1959 in the case of the Cinema Exhibitors Association and 8th April, 1960 in the case of the Association of Independent Cinemas Limited.

The Licensing body and the Interested parties have reviewed and revised the formula by which royalties should be calculated under licenses issued pursuant to Tariff "C" and have reached agreement on a new formula and, by agreement, the tariff has been revised to give effect to this new formula. The essential feature of the new formula is that under it the royalties payable are calculated as a percentage of the actual gross receipts from cinematographic performances at the cinema in place of the former method whereby an estimate of each cinema's receipts was made.

The Reference to the Tribunal is made jointly by the Licensing Body and the Interested Parties and they are jointly applying to the Tribunal to vary the Order dated 6th April, 1961 by making an Order substituting the terms of the revised Tariff "C" for the tariff embodied in the Order of 6th April, 1961 as amended by the Order of 21st January 1963.
