SEIZURE NOTICES

CUSTOMS & EXCISE ACT, 1952

To whom it may concern

Whereas I, William McAllister, an Officer of Customs & Excise, at or in the vicinity of Ballydrumault, Moira, Lurgan in the County of Armagh, on the 16th day of December, 1969, detained a Morris Lorry, Registration Number 4758 OI (or otherwise DSY 856) by virtue of the provisions of Sections 200, 275 and 277 of the Customs & Excise Act 1952.

And Whereas I hereby give notice that I have now seized the aforesaid lorry as being liable to forfeiture under Section 277 of the said Act for the reason that it was being used for the carriage of oil which was liable to forfeiture by virtue of the provisions of Section 200(4) of the said Act.

Now by virtue of the provisions of Par. 3 of the Seventh Schedule to the said Act any person claiming that the said lorry is not liable to forfeiture shall within one month of the date hereof give notice of his claim in writing to the Commissioners of Customs & Excise at any office of Customs & Excise.

Whereupon if on the expiration of the relevant period aforesaid for the giving of notice of claim no such notice has been received by the Commissioners the said lorry shall be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited.

THE IMPORTED LIVESTOCK ORDER, 1958

I, Robert James Wilson (Constable), being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 21st day of December, 1970, at or in the vicinity of The Market Yard, Newry, Co. Down, the under-mentioned nine (9) livestock were seized in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.

Any person claiming that the livestock were at the time of seizure his property and either

(a) that they were not imported removed or brought into the United Kingdom from the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man or the Republic of Ireland, or

(b) that they were not so imported, removed or brought in in contravention of the said Order, may give notice in writing to that effect to the Inspector or other constable in charge at Newry R.U.C. Station, Newry, Co. Down, such notice to be received within 21 days of the date of seizure, or, where notice of the seizure is published in the Belfast Gazette, within ten days of such publication, whichever period shall terminate the later.

If no such claim is received as aforesaid the said Order provides that the livestock shall be deemed to be condemned as forfeited.
