REPORT BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND
INCOMES

Overtime and Shiftworking

On 29th April, 1969 the First Secretary of State and

Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity in pursuance of her powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination the question of the relationship between the length and pattern of the working week including hours of overtime and shift work, and earnings, costs and productivity.

The Board has now made its report, entitled "Hours of Work, Overtime and Shiftworking". In accordance with Section 5(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the Secretary of State for Employment hereby gives notice that the report was first published as Command Paper 4554 on 30th December, 1970.

Paraguay: Official Certificate

The Ministry of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968 it hereby recognises subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto as showing:

- that the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministry and
- that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat and the meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Certificate is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- This recognition applies to meat products imported from Paraguay but does not apply to any such meat product derived from mammals killed when wild.

- The Official Certificate being in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat product or the package containing the meat product.
- Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent indicated in the second Schedule hereto.
- Part II of the Schedule to the Notice published in the Belfast Gazette dated 29th July, 1938, and the Notices published in the Belfast Gazette dated 9th May, 1969, 18th July, 1969, and 15th May, 1970, are hereby revoked.

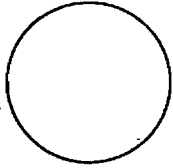
